


## Binsted C of E Primary School - Questionnaire for Parents and Carers 2025 - Results



### Method.

Details of the parents' survey were circulated via the weekly newsletter. Hard copies were handed out at Sport's Day (25<sup>th</sup> June) by parent Governor. Additional paper copies were sent to each family week commencing 30<sup>th</sup> June. Reminders were put in the weekly newsletter until the closing date of 18 2025

### Response rate:

Paper survey forms – 18 received representing 27 pupils

Total of 66 Families – 27.3% response rate

Total of 89 children – 30.3% response rate



<b>Sports and extra curriculum activities</b>		
More activity days e.g. dressing up, scooter or bike days	1	We hold themed whole school days which offer a wide range of activities.
More outdoor facilities in the playground or more clubs for the younger children	1	The school is developing an outdoor learning environment in an area close to the church. Recently a gardening club has been set up and this term a KS1 sports club will be set up and run by the staff.
<b>Communication</b>		
Communication -concerns and/or progress about a child	2	Staff will contact parents if there are any concerns about their child. Interim and end of year reports are used to inform parents of the child’s progress along with parents’ evenings. Parents are always welcome to make an appointment with their child’s class teacher to discuss concerns.
<b>School organisation, procedures and facilities</b>		
It’s hard as a working parent to be as involved as I’d like with assemblies etc. but this isn’t a criticism of the school as there’s not much they can do!	1	Parents are invited into school for class assemblies and to look at their children’s work. If a child’s parent(s) are unable to attend, we always ensure an adult will be available for the child to share their work with.
Toilet maintenance – sounds like they break a lot.	1	Hampshire property services have now replaced the cistern on one of the girl’s toilets which was causing problems last term. We will continue to monitor this.
More specialised SEN provision	1	We have increased the SEND provision to support children with SEND. The school is taking part in Partnerships for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS). This is a national initiative aimed at improving support for neurodiverse children in mainstream primary schools.
More opportunities for children to be praised who aren’t obvious “success” children, the Governors’ awards don’t always seem very positive for the children who don’t meet obvious success criteria	1	Last term a new set of class awards (English, Maths, Determination and Curriculum) were introduced, in addition to the Governors’ awards, to recognise the achievements of more children.
As the school is an advocate for a Smartphone-free childhood it would be great if homework could be moved to a Smartphone/tablet-free system that parents can opt into. I would prefer to print off the requires worksheets independently for my daughter to complete	1	The homework policy will be reviewed aiming to ensure there are options for completing homework on paper as well as on screens.

School organisation, procedures and facilities -Continued		
More teachers on the playground and at breaks	1	We operate a staff rota to cover playground duties and to allow staff to take breaks too.
People parking on the single white line	1	The school encourages parents to park their vehicles responsibly but as it is public highway outside the school, we have no jurisdiction over this. The school is also working with the Parish Council to improve signage and road markings outside the school.
